#### **PROGRAM**

Our APRIL meeting features a unique demonstration by legendary local artist, Lirpa Loof, who unfortunately for us, had to cancel her demonstration last year. If you remember, her hair, which she used as an artist's brush, started to fall out. Now, totally bald, and no longer able to paint, Lirpa, a former ironmonger has combined her love of sculpture with her mastery of the acetylene torch to produce a personal artistic statement in steel. Because the sparks fly freely when Lirpa is welding, she asks that attendees bring their own asbestos overcoats and welding goggles. Fire extinguishers and buckets of sand will be handed out at the door. One lucky winner will be selected to take home her demonstration piece, but you will need access to a forklift and a flatbed truck.

### **OUR REAL PROGRAM**

Our REAL APRIL program features local Cleveland artist, Bonnie Dolin, who will demonstrate *pastels*. Bonnie graduated from the Cleveland Institute of Art and later went on to receive her Masters of Fine Arts from Kent State University. Bonnie is a painter and printmaker whose work has appeared in solo and group exhibitions throughout the Cleveland area for nearly three decades. She has taught at several area colleges and has worked with children through Young Audiences since 1995. Bonnie is a recipient of the 2001 Ohio Arts Council Individual Artist Award, which is just one of many awards she has won. She was also part of the US State Department's "Art in Embassy Program" and was sent to conduct programs in Chisinau, Moldova.

For the last several years the city has been her subject matter of choice, and though she is not particularly interested in specific places, she is drawn to the general industrial areas and neighborhoods. Her attraction stems from the time she spent in Cape Cod photographing the houses there and for a while, they were the subject of a great deal of her work. When she returned to her Cleveland studio, she often photographed the view from her window which overlooked an old commercial and residential area close to the shores of Lake Erie. The many houses in the area reminded her of the cape houses she grew to admire. Bonnie says, "the changing light, color, and weather of this place are an inspiration" to her. Come and enjoy this interesting demonstration.

### THANKS TO ALL

Thanks to our March demonstrator, nationally acclaimed watercolor artist, Paul St. Denis. We received many positive comments from members who both highly enjoyed the presentation and learned new techniques. Paul started with a blank sheet of paper and a rough sketch of an isosceles triangle lying on its side, adding a few brush strokes with earth tones and a row of cliffs was created. A little scraping with a razor blade and a wide putty knife created boulders and rocks, then a few strokes using a wide wash brush created a realistic sky in seconds, a few more strokes added the sea. Paul then continued to use finer and finer brushes to add more details to the scene, combining a very loose image with a variety of specific elements. We were all fascinated by his unique choice of tools — a wide (2"-4") Hake brush made from sheep or

horse hair with a soft irregular edge, a 4" metal paint scrapper and a razor blade, a chiseled edged lettering brush, and fine line Yasutomo brushes for details.

This is a first for Euclid Art ... Lee recorded the entire demonstration and created a 4 minute high definition time-lapse video. Go to You Tube and search "Euclid Art Association, Paul St. Denis" to view the entire demonstration. We will try to record some of our future demonstrations in this format for viewing on You Tube. Stay tuned.
