On **Monday, May 3**, at 7:00p.m. EAA will feature a Zoom demonstration by portrait artist, **Dino Massaroni**. Dino will demonstrate "**Portrait in Pastels**". You may remember his <u>demonstration in March</u> of last year....our last 'live' demo before covid hit! He did an amazing oil portrait of member, Pat Montagno in just under two hours! Dino, a graduate from The Art Institute of Pittsburgh, is best known as an oil portrait artist, painting many doctors, lawyers and some very famous people. He also paints landscapes and still life in oil, pastel and charcoal. He has been a member of the Portrait Society of America since Jan 1998. His paintings have been awarded numerous competitive prizes in national, regional and local exhibits including the Butler Institute of American Art's Annual Midyear Show, American Artists Professional League Annual and Knickerbocker Artists Annual, in New York, and many other Ohio and New York venues.

- Zoom sessions are recorded and offered to participants to view, password provided.
