## **PROGRAM**

The featured artist is **Linda Zolten Wood** demonstrating **Painting on Fabric**. After earning her BFA from Cleveland Institute of Art in 1987, Linda started as a scenery and props artist at Cain Park and The Cleveland Play House, then went on to create large-scale murals in the Greater Cleveland Region. She became inspired by conservation principles influenced by her 1988 travels in India, with a 'no waste' ethic, in which practically everything is re-used in some way. Linda also held a solo exhibit in The Corning Gallery at the Cleveland Museum of Natural History, where she taught wildlife drawing. She currently teaches acrylic painting at Kirtland Public Library, Fairmount Center for the Arts and Shore Cultural Centre and has taught Upcycled Arts Exploration at Cleveland Institute of Art's Continuing Education.
