PROGRAM FOR SEPTEMBER

We are featuring a demonstration by member artist, **Suzette Cohen**. Suzette will demonstrate **Gelli Printing**. What is Gelli printing? It's a modern twist on an ancient process with a reusable gelatin style printing plate to make single prints with acrylic paint. A variety of tools can be used to create textures and patterns. The designs can be created with bubble wrap, plastic grids, cling wrap, sponges, stamps, stencils, leaves, flowers, string, corrugated cardboard, paint brushes, palette knives, cotton swabs and soft marking tools. Papers that are created can be used for collage projects, art journals, card making, or as art itself. Come, learn, and then try it for yourself . . . **sign up NOW for Suzette's workshop on November 5.**

August saw the second "Summer Trifecta Challenge" - **Flower Power!** Any technique or style could be used as long as flowers were the subject. At our Zoom meeting on Saturday August 27, eleven members revealed their unique creations. Several members had fun combining the first challenge, 'bleeding tissue paper' with Flower Power . . . with amazing results! A variety of styles were used, everything from pen and ink drawings to watercolors, acrylic flow painting to photography, and digital art to Lee's computer graphics created by an A.I. What do you think of these?

The third and final challenge of the “Summer Trifecta” is here. Create a piece of art in Monochrome. You choose the subject, media and the one color! Monochrome colors are all the varieties of a single color hue - the tints, shades, and tones. As Joan further explains - *Hue - The single color you choose for your work. It will be your base color. Tint - Makes a color lighter by adding white to your color. Shade - Makes your color darker by adding black. Tone - Change your colors vibrance by adding gray. Made from black and white. If you don't want to use white or black, just change the value of your hue's intensity with water. This is used a lot in watercolor, as in a gray study.* **The Monochrome Zoom reveal is September 24 from 1:00-3:00p.m. Everyone is welcome to participate.**

EAA INVITED TO DISPLAY ART ON EPL GALLERY WALL

The Euclid Public Library has invited Euclid Art Association to stage a **themed exhibit** to hang in the EPL Art Gallery from December 1 to January 31. EAA members will be asked to submit work which supports the library's program “**The Gift of Stories: International Celebrations**” with original works of art. For example, the library will feature displays about Hanukkah, Christmas in Germany and Latin America, Kwanzaa and Winter Solstice. The three-dimensional tomb effigy is made entirely of cotton muslin.
