Hudson graduated from Cooper School of Art with a certificate in Production Art. His first job after art school was a medical illustrator. After getting commissions from several publishing companies, he made the transition to freelance illustrator.

Thomas likes to achieve a natural realism in his drawings and paintings. Although his favorite medium is now oil painting, his pencil drawings are also amazing. The primary theme of his pencil drawings, called "Reminiscent: Our times before yesterday", focused on average people from the year 1885 to 1972. His oil painting theme, "Uniforms at Work", depicts portraits of people dressed in their work clothes. He lets their uniform tell the type of work they do.
