Lirpa has been collaborating with a few of her AI friends in developing Elon Musk's Neural-link for artists. Neural-link interfaces directly with the user's brain. In addition to being a professional artist, Brittany is also a mother of two, published illustrator, Board Member of the Geauga Arts Council and Owner of Creative Spirit Studios, her independent art and web design business.
